

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
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

Fig.1. Maximum on-state dissipation, P_{tot} , versus rms on-state current, $I_{T(RMS)}$, where α = conduction angle.









Fig.2. Maximum permissible non-repetitive peak on-state current I_{TSM} , versus pulse width t_p , for sinusoidal currents, $t_p \le 20$ ms.






Fig.3. Maximum permissible non-repetitive peak on-state current I_{TSM} , versus number of cycles, for sinusoidal currents, f = 50 Hz.


Fig.6. Normalised gate trigger voltage $V_{GT}(T_i)/V_{GT}(25^{\circ}C)$, versus junction temperature T_i WeEn Semiconductors Product specification


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
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











